How do I become a Missionary?



We rejoice with you that your heart is on fire to serve the Lord! This is an answer to earnest prayers of God's children. He said we must pray that He will send out workers into His harvest. Now you want to serve Him and you need to know what to do next. Here it comes:

Pray! Ask for God's will for your life. Request ten friends to pray for you and keep them informed on God's guidance.

Five areas to develop:

1. Missionary Know-How

Bible and Missions Training. In consultation with your pastor and other church leaders decide how and where you can receive Bible and missions training.

Occupation. If the Lord calls you to serve Him e.g. as a teacher you need to be qualified, with a few years experience.

Countries/People Groups. The internet (e.g. www.joshuaproject.net and www.operationworld.org), correspondence with missionaries and by reading mission books and biographies of missionaries.

Specialized Training.

English Teaching - "Teaching English as a Foreign Language" (TEFL) course is part of your equipment to become an English teacher.

Muslim work - Contact Christian Concern for Muslims or SIM South Africa.

Hindu work - Contact Jivannadi.

Chinese work - Contact Karl Teichert from SA Chinese Outreach Network.

Child Evangelism - Petra Institute and Child Evangelism Fellowship offer courses.

Missions Courses. Kairos course, the Perspective on the World Christian movement course, courses offered online by Didasko Academy and discipleship courses offered by Ethnos Movement International, Operation Mobilisation and Youth With a Mission.

Mission Organisations. Get to know mission organisations well to enable you to identify those with which you feel at home. Ask for their newsletters, visit their websites and offices. Ask SAAWE for addresses of missions.

2. Testimony and Spiritual Growth

Salvation and Fullness of the Holy Spirit. You must be sure that you are saved, filled with the Holy Spirit and walking in the power of the Spirit.

Quiet Time. Your personal quiet time is where you grow spiritually. Here you get to know God's voice and you communicate with Him. Pray for local and worldwide needs. Get a personal quiet time book and write down every day what God says to you. Memorize key Scripture verses.

Testify and make Disciples. Do an evangelization course like EE3 or Alpha where you learn how to lead someone to the Lord.

Ask the Lord to lead you to a person of peace and start a Discovery Bible Study with him and his friends or family. Go to www.movements.net for more

Internet Missionary. Contact Ufollo.net and enquire how you can become an internet missionary.

Short Term Outreaches. Contact SAAWE or other mission organisations to find out where you can work for a few weeks or months as a missionary.

Prayer Triplets. This prayer cell consists of three people who come together every week for half an hour to pray for each other, unsaved friends and the world. Every person finds two others and forms another prayer cell.

3. Local Church

Church Involvement. Get involved in your church's ministries like cell groups, evangelism, etc. and in part time mission projects in collaboration with your local church.

Promote missions in your church by arranging World Thrust seminars, missions conferences, short term outreaches, etc. Enquire from World Thrust and SAAWE.

Calling. Share your call with your pastor. Ask your church leaders to seek God's will with you concerning training, field of service, which mission organisation, etc.

Support Team. In collaboration with your church leaders start forming a team that will take responsibility for you on the mission field in the following areas: Morally, Financially, Prayer, Logistics, Communication, Re-entry, etc. Contact SAAWE for more information.

4. Family and Relatives

Don't be surprised if your nearest and dearest family members are upset about your plans to become a missionary. They love you and don't want you to suffer. Be patient and respectful to them without disobeying God.

Spouse. The choice of your spouse is the second most important choice in your life. Make sure he or she shares your vision. If you are already married and your spouse does not share your call, you should wait patiently and lovingly. If God wants to send you, He will also call him or her.

5. Finances.

Cultivate a lifestyle of generosity now, pay your debts and avoid further debt. Give financially to your church, your church's missionary projects and to missionaries. Most mission organisations do not pay salaries. You will need to raise your own support. Disdasko Academy offers an online course on Personal Fundraising for Missionaries. Read 'Daring to Live on the Edge' by Loren Cunningham and 'Friend Raising' by Betty Barnett. Both are available from Youth With a Mission.
